Re: SECOH Services - Update

Hope this communication finds you healthy and safe. We have received several inquiries regarding when we might re-open service centers and resume group services, which depends on COVID-19 infection rate, government orders, and DOH directives. Based on the published county framework effective Thursday, September 24, 2020; groups of 10 or more will not be allowed until tier 3. As long as the infection rate declines within the established parameters we will be able to progress through each tier every four weeks allowing tier 3 to begin in the latter part of November.

Despite the ongoing uncertainty, we are sensitive to the fact that people must make necessary plans in the absence of services. As such, this communication confirms that SECOH centers will remain closed through November 30th. This was a very difficult decision to make however; we are hopeful that the spread of COVID-19 decreases therefore; requiring no further delays and required closures.

During this ongoing absence of ADH/group services SECOH will continue to offer in home and individual services as authorized by the Department of Health. To discuss services offered, please contact your case manager and/or SECOH.
